



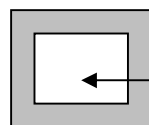

Fusible Web Appliqué Method

Materials needed:

- Fusible Web Transfer (Lite Heat and Bond is a good product)
- Pencil
- Paper scissors
- Fabric scissors
- Iron and ironing board
- Appliqué Pressing Sheet (optional) (product by Bear Threads Designs)

1. Draw a reversed template of the shape on the paper side of the fusible web transfer with a pencil.
2. Cut out the shape leaving a ¼" margin of free space around the shape.
3. To keep your appliqués soft within your block and quilt, trim out the middle of the fusible web shape leaving a ¼" shell of the fusible web.

4. Fuse the fusible web shell to the back of the fabric you are going use, following the temperature recommended on the fusible web instructions.
5. Cut out the shape on the line. Remove the paper backing from the fusible web. Position on the block and fuse.
6. If your block has multi-layered appliqués then it's helpful to use the product, Appliqué Pressing Sheet. This product allows you to

lightly fuse the pieces together into one completed shape. Then you fuse the shape on the block. Example: fuse the four parts of calla lily flower together on the sheet and then fuse the completed flower on the block. The product gives excellent directions on how to use it with your appliqués.

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
